Dear Students, Parents and Carers,

I hope that you are well.

If your son is diagnosed with Covid-19 over the coming weeks can you please inform the school, [admin@kings.lincs.sch.uk](mailto:admin@kings.lincs.sch.uk), so that we have a record of this when we start lateral flow testing on their return.

Your son should be following his normal timetable even if he has not received an invitation to the lesson. The normal physical moving around between lessons is obviously missing and I encourage all students to go for a brief walk or have some light exercise between lessons.

I am delighted to see in the response letter the line *"to secure clarity for students and teachers as quickly as possible."* We believe that consultation will start soon and I will continue to keep you informed as information becomes available.

It is important for both GCSE and A level students to be aware of the statement: *"In line with the parameters set by your policy, we agree that the consultation should consider the nature of the assessments that we will ask teachers to carry out for GCSE, AS and A levels this year. In particular, we will want the consultation to consider the role of externally set short papers. We know that the more the evidence comes from students' performance in externally set papers, the fairer and more consistent teachers' assessments are likely to be, because all students are given the chance to show what they can do in the same way."*

Today Year 11 students should have received their CAT 2 grades which are based on the mock exam and previous assessments. These grades cannot, therefore, be compared to the Centre Assessed Grades (CAGs) that the school will be asked to provide in the future.

## Changes to all students' usernames

As part of our continued improvement in our Information Technology infrastructure we are having to change all student usernames. Passwords will not change. Over the coming weeks students will receive an individualised email informing them that their username is changing.

It will be changed from the format forename.familyname to 20.f.familyname. Please can students watch out for the email confirming that the change is in process.

## Year 9 and Year 10 Vaccinations during Lockdown

We are working with the Regional Health Protection Team to help provide a vaccination programme for Year 9 and Year 10.

The following is a message from the Health Protection Team:

*“Although this may seem strange at a time when we are all worried about COVID-19, routine vaccinations for Year 9s were missed last year, and – due to the lockdown – are in danger of being missed again this year. It is understandable that parents and pupils may not be concerned about the health risks of bacterial Meningitis infection at present, but Meningitis can be an extremely serious condition in children, whereas the risk to a child from COVID is very low. If these vaccines continue to be missed, the risk to children's health will grow, and outbreaks may occur.*

*There has been a national decision that these vital vaccinations need to continue through this lockdown, and Lincolnshire Community Health Services (sic) taking all steps necessary to prevent any risk of COVID transmission during this process.”*

To facilitate this, students have been allocated the following times to come onto site on the days and times in the table below. Please see the letter that you will have received if you have a child in Year 9 or Year 10 to find out more about the arrangements for the vaccinations.
