He trained at Sandhurst and commanded at every rank from Lieutenant to Colonel and worked in both the communications and intelligence fields. He served as a staff officer at the Ministry of Defence and a range of other headquarters where he specialised in strategic policy and plans, including Headquarters Multi-National Iraq in 2008 where he was responsible for the Joint Campaign Plan. lain will talk briefly about his career in the Army and how the skills he learned and developed helped him move from a military to a civilian career, and how he continues to use them in the heritage environment. He will also talk about careers in history and heritage, and the exciting and varied opportunities this sector offers to bright and enthusiastic young people.
